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1 FBI Call Taker: Thank you for calling the FBI, can I have your 2 name and a good contact number for you, please? 3 Sure, my name is Adam, last name is Bereki, it's Bereki: 4 spelled B-E-R-E-K-I. And my phone number is 949-241-5 6693. 6 FBI Call Taker: And your date of birth, Adam? 7 Bereki: 06/18/79. 8 FBI Call Taker: And the zip code you're calling from? 9 Bereki: 92626. 10 FBI Call Taker: And is that common spelling for Adam? A-D-A-M? 11 Bereki: Correct. 12 FBI Call Taker: Okay, give me just one moment, sir. And what is 13 the federal crime that you wish to report today, Adam? 14 Uh, deprivation of federal rights by official Bereki: government actors in California. 15 16 FBI Call Taker: Okay, and what exactly is going on? 17 Bereki: Um, in 2017, uh, I went to a civil case in, um, court 18 in, uh, Orange County. And, um, I was accused of 19 performing construction work without a contractor's 20 license. As a result of that trial, the judge fined 21 me \$930,000. So, he called the action, something in 22 law that's called "disgorgement." So after that 23 happened, I went to appeal, and the appellate court 24 upheld the trial court's ruling. I petitioned to the 25 California Supreme Court and the U.S. Supreme Court,

and both of those petitions were denied. continued -- well let me back up and just say for one second that I'm a retired, um, cop from Huntington Beach, and I have extensive experience in m- -- major fraud and forgery. So, I requested the legislative history of this bill and did what has taken me now, uh, about two years to research what has gone on with this. And what California is essentially doing is they're conducting these actions in a civil court, when what they really are is really highly penal, uh, criminal actions, where you're supposed to have all of the heightened protections of criminal proceedings. Just to give you an example, like let's say that you do work as a contractor, and you don't have a license and you get popped by the, um, State License Board. You get a ticket. It's a -- it's a "misdemeanor." The maximum fine that they can fine you is \$5,000. The -- the fine in California for comparable, uh, offense for like driving without a license is \$450. So, there's clearly a problem here. Um, I do not have the evidence yet, but I'm working on evidence of other I know one man who was fined \$917,000. I know another company that was fined \$22.7 million dollars, although it ultimately got reversed. Um, and what I'm getting at is that people have tried to -- uh



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or have reached out to the legislature to cause change

I apologize 11 if your attorney gave you bad advice and told you to 12 call the FBI, but it would not be a matter that the FBI would assist you with. 13 14 Bereki: Okay, so I -- I -- I am hearing what you're sharing. 15 Keep in mind too, that I'm -- I'm not dumb and an 16 idiot to dismissing cases that seem to be civil on 17 their face when, uh, they -- they are in fact that. 18 But what I'm -- I'm sharing with you, I'm -- I'm not 19 sure if -- if I've made myself clear enough, or maybe you could share with me things that the FBI does 20 21 handle so that, um, I can be clear that you're not the 22 agency that I need to be with, because what I'm 23 sharing with you is that although the initial part of 24 this began in the civil context, the actions that were 25 taken by the ac- -- the state actors and the state

officials in this case, have nothing to do with the 1 2 initial civil case. They took criminal action in the 3 That -- I'm not reporting the civil case to 4 you. 5 FBI Call Taker: Okay. 6 Bereki: I'm reporting the actions on behalf of the state 7 actors that are criminal that deprived me of --FBI Call Taker: Okay, sir, what I'm telling you though is the 8 9 FBI is not going to be able to assist you, okay? So, 10 the fact that your attorney gave you bad advice, I 11 mean, you can seek different legal counsel, but that's 12 not gonna change the fact that the FBI's not going to be able to assist you, okay? 13 14 Okay, can you -- can you differentiate for me which Bereki: 15 (inaudible - 00:06:52) --16 FBI Call Taker: Sir, I'm not going to differentiate anything 17 for you. I -- I'm simply telling you who you would need to talk to, and it would not be the FBI. 18 19 Bereki: Okay. I -- I get that. But I just read -- let me 20 pull it up here on my computer. Um, I appreciate you 21 staying with me here. I -- I understand that you may 22 be frustrated, but, um --23 FBI Call Taker: Sir, I -- there are other calls that I do need 24 to take, and as you are not reporting a -- a federal 25 matter that we would be able to assist you with, I'm
