Hello, sir. I'm doing okay. How are you today? 1 Bereki: 2 Lopez: Pretty good, Adam. Thank you for asking. How can I 3 help you? You're welcome. Sir, I -- I -- I'm -- I just wanna 4 Bereki: 5 let you know I'm a former Huntington Beach cop. 6 Lopez: Okay. 7 And, um, I've got a really, really, really serious Bereki: 8 problem. And, um --9 Lopez: Okay. 10 Bereki: -- I don't know if you're gonna be able to help me, 11 but it's gonna test the bounds of your -- your limits. 12 So, um, long story short, I'm, uh, about to be evicted 13 from my home. 14 Lopez: Okay. 15 Bereki: Um, and -- sorry, let me take a deep breath here. 16 Lopez: Go ahead. 17 Bereki: Um, after I got out of law enforcement, um, I got into 18 construction work and, uh, I had a beef with, uh, a 19 client and we ended up in court. No worry, civil 20 case, whatever. As a result of that case, I got fined 2.1 a million dollars for allegedly not having a 22 construction license. 23 Lopez: Okay. 24 Bereki: Even though I have one. You can look up my name on

the contractor state license board.

1 Lopez: Okay. 2 Bereki: Uh, I appealed the judgment and they said that I 3 wasn't being punished. Well, I don't know what the 4 hell a million dollar fine is but that's what it is. 5 So they didn't apply any of the excessive fines clause 6 protections, nothing. 7 Lopez: Okay. 8 Bereki: And if you go and look up the maximum penalty for 9 first offense, unlicensed contracting, it's one 10 million -- it's five -- five -- \$5,000, not one 11 million. 12 Lopez: Okay. Okay? So the fine that they imposed on me is 146 13 Bereki: 14 times the maximum allowable fine. 15 Lopez: Mm-hmm. 16 Bereki: So, um, I pursued my case all the way to the U.S. 17 Supreme Court and all of them refused to vacate the 18 judgment. So then I started going to -- oh, let me 19 back up -- as a result of my inability to pay the fine 20 they suspended the license that I have, so I couldn't 2.1 So now I couldn't work to pay my bills and I 22 needed to be able to have someone to represent me, so 23 I couldn't pay a lawyer. So I had to do that myself. 24 So, uh, long story short, I got forced into 25 bankruptcy. I tried to tell the judge what was going



on in bankruptcy and he basically ignored me, like the 1 2 other judges have been doing. 3 Lopez: Oh. So, long and the short of that, uh, my license got 4 Bereki: 5 suspended, they -- I got into bankruptcy, and then 6 they, uh -- because I was unable to pay, uh, my 7 mortgage, they -- the bank foreclosed on my house. 8 Lopez: Okay. 9 Um, and so after going through all the court system I Bereki: 10 went to -- I started going to law enforcement. I 11 reached out to the sheriff's department, I -- I 12 contacted the, um, uh, California Department of 13 Justice, the attorney general, um, everybody. Uh, and 14 four municipal police departments: Newport, Costa 15 Mesa, Irvine, Santa Ana, yes. And, now when I was a 16 cop, um, one of my things was I did very complex, high 17 end, uh, forensic investigations. That was --18 Lopez: Yes. 19 Bereki: -- my niche in law enforcement. 20 Yes. Lopez: 2.1 Bereki: Um, so, uh, basically I had discovered that I'm not 22 the only, so to speak, victim of this, that the 23 judiciary has been doing this to Ca- -- people in 24 California for at least the last 30 years. 25 Lopez: Mm-hmm.



And there's no remedy in any branch of government, in 1 Bereki: 2 California or the United States. And so, as a result 3 of them foreclosing on my home because of this situation they then just stole \$1.18 million in equity 4 5 that I have in the house. So you're the last line of 6 defense, bro. I --7 Mm-hmm. Lopez: 8 Bereki: -- I -- I hate to put it on you but you can make your 9 decision on what you're gonna do or not do. 10 I -- at this point I have the right to use deadly 11 force to defend my rights and property. I'm not going 12 to do that because I do not want to hurt anybody over 13 some fucking money and a property, all right? 14 Lopez: Yeah. 15 Bereki: However -- however, I'm not going to leave here until 16 you tell me that basically, "Look, you're going to 17 jail if you don't leave." So, um, that's what --(Inaudible - 0:04:21). 18 Lopez: 19 Bereki: -- what I would ultimately like you to do is to do a -20 - a fair investigation that nobody has done so far, 2.1 and to look into this matter and to stop it. But 22 everybody says, "Oh, you need to go to the court, you 23 need to get an emergency stay. You need to do all 24 this." That's the problem. The court is the problem. 25 Literally, I went to get an emergency stay a couple



of, uh, like last week on the 14th, and the judge said 1 2 to me, "You need to get over this, it's final, and get 3 on with it, your life." Denied. Um, so they do not tell me that I'm doing anything in law wrong. I know 4 5 I'm not. I've been investigating this for six years -6 7 Lopez: Yeah. -- and they're covering up for their judicial buddies, 8 Bereki: 9 basically. You know, like everybody talks about us 10 having, like, some -- some code of silence and 11 bullshit like that, no, I never saw it when I was a 12 cop for ten years. But they've got it, and they're 13 doing it. Um, and so that's where I'm at. 14 Mm-hmm. Lopez: 15 Bereki: So, bottom line is the attorney who's representing the 16 guy who so-called owns the house, he, uh, he gave me 17 until this Sunday to be out, um, and that's what I'm 18 doing, but I'm -- I'm trying to make one last-ditch 19 effort to reach out to you guys to see if you will do 20 the right thing. Yeah, as far as -- Adam, as far as -- as far as this 21 Lopez: 22 goes, like I can't conduct an investigation because --23 so I'm a sergeant with the Civil Bureau, right? 24 Bereki: Yeah. 25 So we basically conduct the -- the evictions. Lopez:



once it gets to -- to where -- where I work, and with the deputies that I -- that I supervise, it's already a done deal, whether, you know, the -- the paperwork's already come across, um, our office desks -- desk, and comes straight to the deputies. So the deputies don't -- don't conduct investigations, um, they don't even, when we get the addresses to do, uh, the -- the evictions or temporary restraining orders, we don't even, um -- we can't even conduct any -- we can't even look at the paperwork, the whole packet, or conduct our own investigations. We can't use any of our resources to conduct any investigations. Like they're -- we're not allowed because of -- because we're doing civil, um, work, handling civil, um, uh, cases. Bereki: Yeah, but if somebody reports to you that there's a crime being committed in your process and that you're going to be held liable, and -- a- as a -- as a law enforcement officer for, um, you know, somebody's giving you notice that there's a crime being committed, and you say, "Well, I don't have any authority to look at the paper," well, I hear what you're saying but I -- I'm gonna be very blunt with you, that's bullshit. Lopez: Okay.

So, you 9 know, we can come back again, we'll give you a date 10 for you to leave, and then we come back and -- and 11 check up on you to see if you're leaving and whatnot. 12 We'll do a couple of checks before -- before we 13 actually have to, um, uh, conduct an eviction. And 14 un- -- unfortunately, uh, is there an op- -- uh, a 15 possibility that you can get arrested? Yes, there's 16 always a possibility that you can get arrested. But 17 we don't wanna go down that route. 18 Bereki: Right. So -- but what I'm -- I'm trying to get clear 19 from you is if I stick it out and I don't leave, is 20 that what will likely happen? 21 No, that -- that -- I wouldn't be able to te- --Lopez: 22 answer that question. That -- that's a option, that's 23 a possibility. That's always a possibility that you 24 can get arrested. But I wouldn't be able to get --25 give you the -- the answer yet because we don't have -



1 - a) I don't have a case for -- for your property, and 2 b) we haven't talked to you and -- and, uh, and we -we haven't gone back to, you know, communicating as 3 far as the -- what your -- your plan is for -- for 4 5 this to continue. 6 Bereki: Well I'm -- I -- I underst- -- I heard you, but I 7 just told you what my plan is.
