by statute is 5,000, and they fined me a million. when I couldn't afford to pay that, obviously because I don't have that amount of money, they suspended the license that I do have, saying -- and they never gave me a hearing, you know, to contest it. So I haven't been able to earn a living in my profession as a general contractor for over six years, and I wasn't able to pay my bills. So then the bank foreclosed on my house, and now I'm facing eviction. I've gone through the entire court system, and I've gone to local law enforcement to get people to investigate this, and they all say, "We're not investigating it." Um, I'm not the only victim of this. There are potentially dozens, or -- or more people that this has happened to, and we're going -- everybody has been going to different branches of government, and they're all refusing to help. Um, and so this is the last line of defense. I literally just got off the phone with Sergeant Lopez from the Sheriff's Department, the Civil Enforcement Unit, and he's lying to me, telling me that they don't have any ability to do investigations in the Civil Enforcement Unit, even though he's a sworn, um, police officer in California. And he told me, "We're not going to investigate this. Call Costa Mesa, " um, because I live in your city.

And so --5 Maradakas: Right so -- so we, as you -- as you are well aware 6 as -- as a police officer, we as police officers, we 7 investigate crimes, uh, not -- not civil 8 investigations. 9 Okay, but I don't unders- -- can you please inform me Bereki: 10 why you don't think this is the crime when there's --11 the government is taking property without lawful 12 authority by force? Maradakas: Well, it's -- it seems like it's a higher entity 13 14 than just some municipal law enforcement agency, don't 15 you think? 16 Bereki: Well, if they're not -- no, I don't, and -- and here's 17 Because you have a -- as a police officer, I why. 18 swore an oath to support the constitution. And if 19 somebody comes to me and tells me that their rights 20 are being violated by another public official, and 21 that that action is criminal because that public 22 official is not following the law, then I believe I 23 have a duty to investigate that as a -- as a police 24 officer. It's happening in my jurisdiction. 25 So do -- these -- these public officials, what --Maradakas:



what entity are they? Are they county level? What -what type of, uh -- I mean, what level are they at? Well, I'm -- I'm talking about unlawful orders from a Bereki: judge. A coun- -- county -- or it's Superior Court Judge. Maradakas: Okay. And -- and a -- and a -- a State, uh, Appellate Judge. Bereki: Maradakas: Okay. Then I would go reach out to the Orange County District Attorney's Office, because they do have some sort of internal investigators who can do that as well. Bereki: Okay, I've done that, and -- I've done that, and they're part of the problem. They're not investigating this. This is -- this is what I'm saying to you, my situation is. I tried all these resources, and everybody says, "We don't know what to do, we're not doing it. Call this person." And I've called all those people, and they're all refusing. And so that -- I understand how bizarre this sounds. I have evidence l- -- I mean, in -- when I was a policeman, one of my specialties was very complex forensic investigations. Um, you can go to my website. I have every single audio tape recording of every public official interaction available there. You can verify all of the law. Everything that I'm

saying is legit, correct, and I can back it up with actual case law.

There's nothing here that's -- I'm asking anyone to go out on a limb and try to like do something weird. No, it's legit. The -- the judges are covering it up to protect themselves, and the -- the -- the people that are supposed to be a check and balance in our government, right we have checks and balances, the -- the Executive Branch is not serving as a check and balance on the Judicial. And so that's why this has been allowed to continue for more than 30 years. And some of these other people, they've had to give up. They've lost their homes. They've had to move out of state to -- to start their business over again, and nobody's doing anything about it, because --

Maradakas: Okay.

Bereki: -- it's going to expose a lot of corruption. And, you know, I -- I know that it's a precarious situation.

Um, but like I said, have all of the evidence to back it up. All I need is for someone to verify, so to speak, what I'm saying is true, and then take remedial action to prevent me from being evicted in the short term, and then do an investigation into this corruption in the long term.



Maradakas: Okay. So -- so sir, I would redirect you to the 1 2 Orange County District Attorney's Office, because we 3 as police officers, we can't investigate internal actions or misconduct within the, uh, the DA's office 4 5 or the county level. Um -- um, telling you flat out, 6 we're -- we're not gonna do that. 7 Um, you can't investigate --Bereki: 8 Maradakas: Civil issues? No. Any type of misconduct from 9 county officials, we're not gonna investigate that. 10 That's not -- that's not in our wheelhouse, and we -we don't do that. 11 12 Bereki: Okay, so you're telling me that you can't help me. 13 Maradakas: Correct, I'm redirecting you to the Orange County 14 District Attorney's -- Attorney's Office. 'Cause they 15 -- they have the investigators who investigate 16 internal issues. 17 Bereki: Literally, they -- they have refused. I- -- I'm not 18 joking you, sir. 19 Maradakas: I -- I d- -- sir, I don't know what to tell you. 20 Bereki: Okay, so you guys are going to refuse to protect my 21 rights and property and to take a -- a report? 22 Maradakas: I'm -- I'm redirecting you to the Orange County 23 District Attorney's Office, that's what I'm doin'. 24 Bereki: Right, but I told you that that doesn't work. 25 I've already made a complaint to them and they're not

I've written them three times. I've -- I've spoken 12 with their investigator, the supervising investigator. 13 14 His name's Rick Bradley. They're not doing an 15 investigation. I'll be happy to give you the 16 paperwork that shows you that they're not doing it. Ι 17 have a letter from them. 18 Maradakas: And we are the police department, we're not gonna 19 investigate another misconduct from another agency. 20 Bereki: Okay, I don't want you to investigate the DA's Office, 21 I just want you to protect my rights and property. 22 I'm not asking you to investigate any other agency. 23 I'm just saying protect my rights and property because
